HPCG Timeline

1978 – HPCG steering committee formed.

1980 – Anonymous \$27,500 gift and first annual meeting of the membership. First office space designated at the Public Health Department.

1982 – Patient care initiated with two part-time staff (Rosenborough and Schuman).

1984 – Moses Cone Hospital joint ventures with HPCG to become an institutional member.

1985 – First full-time executive director and nursing coordinator hired (Barrett and Taylor). Second office space designated at 811 N. Elm Street.

1987 – First inpatient hospice unit in North Carolina opened at Moses Cone Hospital. Third office space designated at 706 N. Greene Street.

1989 – Grief Counseling Center developed. Office space expanded to include 705 N. Greene Street.

1991 – A permanent home for HPCG. 2.1 million raised for 2500 Summit Avenue.

1992 – Kaleidoscope Kids affiliation with United Way.

1994 – Joint venture to initiate Lighthouse Residence with Hospice of the Piedmont and Triad Health Project.

1995 – Annual meeting of the membership.

1996 – Beacon Place, a 12-bed residential facility, is opened.

1997 – The Annual Time Warner Cable Celebrity Golf Tournament in memory of Sharon Bostic completes its final year and raises more than \$500,000 for HPCG in its 10-year history.

1998 – A grant-funded innovative project promoting palliative care and end-of-life care education for health care professionals initiated.

1999 – 20th anniversary campaign for HPCG (\$1.6 million) initiated in support of children's programs and program endowments.

2000 – Kids Path expands its palliative care services.

2001 – Kids Path building opens at 2504 Summit Avenue.

2002 – HPCG is accredited by the Accreditation Committee for Health Care (ACHC) Kids Path expanded in the Carolinas.

2005 – HPCG celebrates 25 years of caregiving.

2010 – Beacon Place is renovated to add two additional patient rooms/beds.

2012 – Logo change and new tag line created, "Capturing Moments that Really Matter."

2014 – The John A. Lusk, III, MD Caregiving Education Center opens at 2501 Summit Avenue, and the Hospice Foundation of Greater Greensboro (HFGG) is established.

2015 – HPCG celebrates 35 years of caregiving.
