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## **Corks for Kids Path Raises Funds for Medically Fragile and Grieving Children**

(GREENSBORO, NORTH CAROLINA)— A new fundraising record was set at the 2016 Corks for Kids Path event in March. Green Valley Financial led the effort with a presenting sponsorship. This gift—combined with host sponsorships, proceeds from the silent auction, ticket sales and profits from the wine sales generously donated by Zeto Wine & Cheese Shop—raised \$139,070 (gross)/\$105,347 (net) to support medically fragile and grieving children served by Kids Path.

Henry Magazine, Painted Plate, Yelp and Zeto Wine & Cheese Shop, the event drew more than 600 guests.
